## NOTICE

A Notice of Intent for the following project submitted in accordance with R307-401-1, Utah Administrative Code (UAC), has been received for consideration by the Director:

**Company Name:** RN Industries  
**Location:** RN Industries - Bluebell Disposal Facility – 8 miles west of Roosevelt, Roosevelt, UT

**Project Description:** RN Industries (RNI) owns and operates the Bluebell Disposal Facility (Bluebell Facility) located approximately 8 miles west of Roosevelt and 7 miles east of Bluebell. The Bluebell Facility operates an oil cleaning facility and a landfill. The landfill is used to dispose of three types of waste: 1) reclaimed landfarm soils; 2) imported solids; and 3) solids from tank bottoms and the filter press/centrifuge. The reclaimed soils are generated as part of the reclamation of the landfarms. RNI no longer operates the landfarms and is in the process of reclaiming these areas. The vast majority of soils to be disposed of at the landfill will be reclaimed landfarm soil. Imported solids mostly consist of soils generated offsite from Energy and Production (E&P) operations and excavation from leaks and spills. Solids from tank bottoms and the filter press/centrifuge will be generated in the onsite oil cleaning facility. The oil cleaning facility accepts dirty oil and oily solids from the surrounding production field, specifically from tank bottoms, dump-off bins, and Hydrovac dumps. The dirty oil and oily solids received are processed in covered tanks and a filter press/centrifuge to separate water, oil, and residual solids.

RNI has requested a modification to Approval Order DAQE-AN146050005-21, dated January 7, 2021, for their Bluebell Facility. RNI has requested to increase their throughput limitations for the landfill from 340 cubic yards (CY) of tank bottom/filter press solids and 20,400 CY of imported hydrocarbon-contaminated waste to 450 CY of tank bottom/filter press solids and 85,000 CY of imported hydrocarbon-contaminated waste. This will allow the facility to dispose of waste in multiple permitted landfill cells. As part of this modification, haul road emissions will be increasing.

The completed engineering evaluation and air quality impact analysis showed the proposed project meets the requirements of federal air quality regulations and the State air quality rules. The Director intends to issue an Approval Order pending a 30-day public comment period. The project proposal, estimate of the effect on local air quality, and draft Approval Order are available for public inspection and comment at the Utah Division of Air Quality, 195 North 1950 West, Salt Lake City, UT 84116. Written comments received by the Division at this same address on or before December 19, 2025, will be considered in making the final decision on the approval/disapproval of the proposed project. If anyone so requests to the Director in writing within 15 days of publication of this notice, a hearing will be held in accordance with R307-401-7, UAC.

Under Section 19-1-301.5, a person who wishes to challenge a Permit Order may only raise an issue or argument during an adjudicatory proceeding that was raised during the public comment period and was supported with sufficient information or documentation to enable the Director to fully consider the substance and significance of the issue. **Date of Notice: November 19, 2025**
